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Post-Operative Instructions for Fillings

- 1. If you received novocaine today:
- a. You will probably experience soreness at the site of the injection, and possibly some mild swelling or minor ulceration. Warm salt-water rinses may be soothing for the soreness. Orabase[®] with benzocaine can be applied to any ulcers or blisters. It is available at your pharmacy.
- b. In rare cases, bruising or muscle tightness may be evident. This will usually clear up in 1-2 weeks without further treatment.
- c. Do not eat while numbness is still present.
- 2. Do not eat on the side where silver fillings were placed for the first 24 hours.
- 3. If both sides have new silver fillings, eat soft foods like soup or spaghetti for the first 24 hours.
- 4. Sensitivity is very common after fillings:
- a. Usually due to cold, but heat may also be bothersome.
- b. The sensitivity could last up to a few weeks afterwards. Try to avoid foods and liquids that aggravate this condition.
- c. The teeth may ache or throb. Advil[®], Aspirin, or Tylenol[®] may be needed to relieve this discomfort.
- 5. Silver fillings usually last quite a few years with proper care; large ones may require a crown (cap) at a future time.
- 6. Tooth-colored fillings are used in areas of cosmetic concern; however, they do not last as long as silver fillings.
- 7. If a tooth colored filling was placed on the edge of a front tooth, certain precautions must be observed:
- a. Do not bite on anything hard such as ice, hard candy, or nuts.
- b. Do not bite on pens, pencils, fingernails, etc.
- c. Do not open bobby pins.
- d. Try not to bump or get bumped on the front teeth.
